- We Grow: Kim has seedlings under lights; Ellen has seedlings in winter sewing containers.
- GROW: Francine new proposal from Community Garden by Chris Burrington; one will be coming from Francine re: Nader Towers.

New Facebook post today: Please read report from Carol Phelps on Greenspace and use of it. We need to know to use GIS from Otsego County and how it affects us.

- Seed Swap review: Ellen Alex reported 100-150 people; all seeds given out. Flower seeds were gone, a few vegetables seeds remain. Some people took lots of seeds, filling bags and shopping bags. Catherine McGuire shared that Seed Swap Day was a happy day.
- Gardening: Choose Your Own Adventure workshop: Francine reported 29 people registered; for future presentations, need someone to monitor chat; good first try at this workshop.
- Spring Garden Day: David had not heard from OCCA; will get in touch with them. SGD Committee: Susan Jones (Chair), Peter Coleman, Ellen Alex, Darleen Fournier, David Cox.
- Education & Outreach: See report attached. Francine noted the memorial for Joan Riley. Tina McGurrin will work with Francine re: a path of white stones and a plaque on a stone in her memory. MGs will dedicate a new tree at the Education Center with a plaque in her memory.

Dr. Steve Reiners (and graduate students) will present (Zoom) on plant breeding – 'How a Plant Comes to Be', March 1, 6:30 p.m. This will help us better understand the plant breeding process and dispel misinformation.

Finance-Budgets / Grounds / Grow w/CCE:

- Mary Ellen Crawford noted that budgets were sent to committee chairs.
- Plant Sale: Carol confirmed the sale is Saturday, May 20, 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. See report attached. Let her know if any changes need to be made to the committee; add Peter Coleman. House plants are needed for plant sale. Francine will do a Facebook post on propagating house plants. Poster will be reworked for this year. Seeds will be distributed today for those who come to pick up for seed starting. See seed starting dates in plant sale report, attached.
- Grounds / Grow with CCE: Peter reported that the Signage Committee met several times to work on the signage; will finalize with Liz who will be working with the designer to get the signs completed. QR codes discussed; may not be a good idea.

Plant lists will be sent out once Peter gets them finalized. Beds identified, plant selection, and plant orders are in progress.

Committee recommends stone dust and TrueGrid be used to finish the project within the gardens. For fencing, see attached report. Additional funding is needed to finalize the beds, so that we can plant in April and May. Grounds Committee recommended that \$10,000 be allocated to the GROW w/CCE funds to complete this phase. Motion by Peter Coleman; second by Carol Phelps. Motion approved.

- VVGT: Plants have four beds that will need staking. Do we want uniform staking or do four different types for educational purposes? TBD at a later date; suggestions welcome.



Review of 2022 Post Plant Sale Notes

Quick review of 2022 Post Plant Sale Notes. Highlighting our success of excellent quality and breadth of product. Kim reported we have 16 seed starters this year which means we may have more product, but also room for some crop failure while still ensuring high quality product.

As excellent publicity was also part of our success, we had preliminary discussion. Social Media outreach is critical. Seed Starters should start sending photos to Francine of our efforts to build interest. Pati has contacted 5-Star Subaru via email to gauge their interest in supporting our effort. Peter will follow up with them in person on Thursday. 5-Star will also want photos of Master Gardener efforts in all areas to use in publicity. If you have any, send them to Pati.

Discussion of 2023 Plant Sale Planning Calendar

Those present looked over calendar with a few adjustments.

- Add Emma Kirsch and Kelley O'Rourke to Seed Starters list.
- Update on Seed Starting dates. There will **not** be Seed Starting in conjunction with the Plant Sale Meeting of March 20. A new date **added** is Monday, March 27 at 10:00. Perennial plug pick-up and potting will be Saturday, March 11 from 1:30 to 4:30 and Wednesday, March 15 from 10:00 to 2:00.

Supplies Needed for Plant Sale

- Tables for day of sale: Sources are our 6 six tables, Schoharie County's tables and Cooperstown Presbyterian Church tables. We need to cover church tables and make sure they are returned clean. Tablecloths are in the basement.
- Tables to keep plants on as they are brought to CCE before the sale: We no longer have any plywood or sawhorses to use in alcove. We will ask if anyone has ones we can borrow for the effort. Discussed alternatives of placing them on the unplanted raised beds.
- Tents. We have two, but need a third. Group decided not to purchase an additional one, but ask to borrow one.
- Mary Ellen presented the first labels she has produced for the plants.
- Safety vests for traffic control. Mary Ellen will ask to borrow three from Glimmerglass Opera.
- Hand-out card to give to purchasers of perennials about how to successfully grow them on in Otsego County
- Poster about which of our products are good pollinators.

Product

- Seed starting supplies and seeds have been distributed and people are reporting initial success. Kim reminds seed starters to watch calendar to start seeds on time for a good quality product by May 20. Blooming flowers are an easier sale.
- Perennial plugs are ordered and will be picked up March 11 by Kim. This is a new effort to increase our supply of native perennials and we will monitor the effort to decide if we will continue it in the future.
- We also want to test if houseplants are a desired product. If Master Gardeners have houseplants, they will be encouraged to propagate them now, so we have a quality product to sell.
- Next meeting is March 20, 10:00, Zoom or in-person. Publicity plans will be finalized. As we will also be discussing the layout of the sale, in-person attendance is encouraged.
