
How to Upload Documents and Journals: For this tutorial, learn how to submit a **Journal entry** or other assignment that requires uploading a document by following these steps.



Each week we will open a new series of topics. The current week will always be highlighted in yellow. When each week is over, that week's section will collapse and will only show the title bar. You can still access the prior weeks and go back, by clicking on the title bars, which will open them up again.

Step one:

Within each weekly section you will see a list of assignments, resources and readings for each topic. Click on each title next to their icon to be linked to that activity. To submit your **Journal entry**, click on the title as shown to the right.



Step two:

When you are ready to submit your assignment, click on "Add submission" as shown to the right.



Step three: Preferred optionUpload a document.


To upload a Word or Pages document (a file saved on your computer), choose the bottom box as shown to the right.

Click on the file icon on the top left corner of that box.




Step four:

To upload a Word or Pages document (a file saved on your computer), follow these steps shown to the right.




Step five

This shows your file uploaded correctly.




Step six
